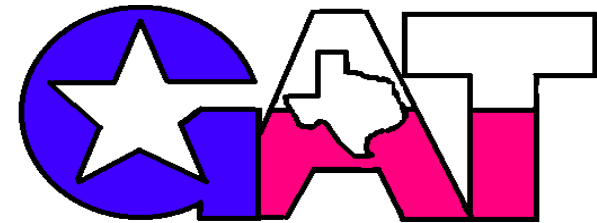

KEVIN MUENZ

Kevin started his journey into the world of gymnastics, at the age of 12, as manager of a high school gymnastics team in Yorktown Heights, New York. The following year, the family moved to the suburbs of Chicago, a hot bed for high school gymnastics, where he attended John Hersey high school, in Arlington Heights, Illinois. As a high school gymnast, he helped his team win the state championship and placed 2nd in the all around behind Bart Conner. During his senior year, he was invited to the first Olympic development camp held by the then USGF in Lincoln, Nebraska, and placed 3rd at the first ever National High School All Around Invitational in Chicago, Illinois.

A college scholarship led him to Southern Illinois University at Carbondale, under the direction of Coach Bill Meade. As a college gymnast, Kevin was a member of the USGF National Men's Team and received the bronze medal on pommel horse at the USGF National Championships in Baton Rouge, Louisiana. After graduating from SIU-C with a degree in Education, Kevin worked on his Masters in Biomechanics and Physiology of Exercise and helped Coach Meade with the gymnastics team. The experience with Meade planted the seeds for Kevin to venture into the world of coaching.

Coach Muenz moved to Garland, Texas in 1982 and is now in his 27th year of coaching at Lakeview Centennial High School. Believe it or not, Mark Sherman actually helped Kevin get his job. During this time, his teams have won 5 high school state championships; he has been honored 3 times by the Texas High School Gymnastics Coaches Association as their Coach of the Year and in 1991 he was awarded the prestigious National High School Coach of the Year award. Kevin's gymnasts have won many state, regional and national titles at the high school and club levels.

Currently, Kevin is the USA Gymnastics men's state chairman, a post he has held for 18 years. He has also been a nationally certified judge for the past 26 years and an officer in the THSGCA for over 20 years. However, he has never been a member of the GAT board much to the delight of Cheryl Jarrett.

Kevin admits that none of this could have been possible without the loving support of his first wife (and last) Debbie and their 3 children plus the dog that chews up all the wood pens he makes in his garage shop.

Scott, owner of Lone Star Gymnastics in Ft. Worth, came to Texas from California, where he earned a Bachelor of Science degree. He served as Head Coach of SCAT Gymnastics from 1972 to 1979 and has been active in coaching ever since, placing many gymnasts on National and International Teams. He has been and is still active in numerous professional groups including USAG Board of Directors; USAG Texas State Board, both women and men; Region III Board Member and Director of TOPS Program. Scott has received over 30 International coaching assignments and has authored JO National Compulsory Uneven Bars routines and published over 20 articles on Coaching, Mechanics and Technique of Skills. He was co-architect in designing the USA Gymnastics National Training Center and US Olympic Training Center at Colorado Springs; is founder and past president of California State Coaches Association and Texas Women's Gymnastics Coaches Association, was past Region III Director for USAG National TOPS Program; was past member of USAG Region III Board for Women, to mention a few of his accomplishments. Scott is currently a member of the USAG Texas State Board for both Women and Men. He has received over 20 International Coaching Lecture Assignments and designed and built the first in-ground pits, the first spring floor using metal springs, and the first fiberglass uneven bar rails for women in the United States. Outside the gym, Scott enjoys golf, boating, rock climbing, cooking, writing, collecting art and Olympic memorabilia, but most of all, he enjoys life.

HIDEO “MIZO” MIZOGUCHI

For 10 years coach Hideo Mizoguchi was the USAG Technical Director for the JO National Program. Prior to this he was the junior coach for four years of eventual 1984 Olympians. “Coach Mizo” as he is known, competed in the elite Japanese program in the 1970’s until a lower back injury shortened his career. He has a Masters Degree in PE from the University of Oregon. He is currently the co-owner of Champion Gymnastics Academy in Katy, Texas. Jerit is an FIG rated judge and is currently the JO Technical Director for Region 3. He has been involved in men’s gymnastics as an athlete, coach, judge and gym owner for over 20 years. In 1995 Gizi transitions from being a gym owner and coach to officiating, judging levels 4 through 10. She has judged at almost every level both club and college and in April of 2008 Gizi retired. John has also been the financial officer for GAT serving on the board since 2001.

SOKOL KHB—

Sokol Karel Havlicek Borovsky, a physical, educational and cultural organization, was organized in 1908 in Ennis, Texas by Czech immigrants as a means to carry on the heritage they brought from their homeland. Ennis Sokol is celebrating its Centennial year in 2008. As the oldest Sokol unit in Texas, it has played a vital role in the Czech and gymnastics history of Texas. It is commonly recognized as the first gymnastics "club" and the oldest continuous gymnastics program in Texas.

This 100 year milestone in Sokol history is the result of dedication, perseverance and resiliency that had its beginning in 1908 when as more and more Czech families settled in Ennis, a group of men met to for Sokol there. The founding fathers chose Czech national hero, Karel Havlicek Borovsky, as namesake. These leaders made plans to secure apparatus and to utilize the technical knowledge they had brought with them to this country. The immigrants were a proud group, striving to become good Americans while preserving their heritage. They applied the more general definition of gymnastics as "any physical movement". Mass group exercises, tumbling and balancing were also important to the Sokol Program. The basic Sokol idea was and still is today is to train youth and adults so that they may become physically, mentally and morally fit. Programs address the needs of small tots through senior citizens (80+). Literally thousands of children, teens and adults have passed through the Ennis Sokol programs.

GAT 2008 the Sokol Organization will be teaching group closing ceremonies choreography to be presented at the Sport International and Cultural Festival which will take place in Ft. Worth in 2009. This sports festival will include mass Sokol demonstrations in conjunction with USAG TeamGymn Nationals, National Gymfest , Aesthetic Competition and Festival Rhythmic.
